Should I make a Will?

Yes. It means your assets and belongings go to the people you want when you die.

What is a Will?

A Will is a document that specifies the people you want to receive your money and things after you die.

How can I make sure my wishes are carried out?

What happens if I don't make a Will?

What if I marry or divorce?

Marriage revokes wills. Separation or divorce means you must make a new Will.

Can I leave my assets to anyone I please?

Yes, but you should make proper provision for your spouse and all children.

Where should I keep my Will?

What if I am Incapacitated?

You need someone to be appointed under a Power of Attorney and an Enduring Guardianship.
